Application Guidelines Habilitative Interventionist for ages 3 through 17

These guidelines include the requirements for professionals seeking to provide Habilitative Intervention for children ages three through seventeen (3-17) as defined in IDAPA 16.03.10.685.03.a-c

Providers of Habilitative Intervention must meet the following minimum qualifications:

- a) Must hold at least a bachelor's degree in a human services field from a nationally-accredited university or college;
- b) Must be able to provide documentation of one (1) year's supervised experience working with children with developmental disabilities. Experience must be gained through paid employment or university practicum experience or internship;
- c) Must complete competency coursework approved by the Department to demonstrate competencies related to the requirements to provide Habilitative Intervention.

*Individuals who hold their BCBA or BCaBA will meet all requirements for the HI Certificate of Completion.

How do I apply for Certificate of Completion?

Your application packet must include:

- 1. **Application** for Habilitative Intervention Certificate of Completion.
- 2. Documentation that you meet requirement **a. Degree**: Copy of BCBA or BCaBA Certificate. (*If you hold a BCBA or BCaBA Certificate, you can stop here. You meet all requirements.) -or- Copy of **Degree Diploma** demonstrating at least a bachelor degree in a human service field. (***Note:** A copy of the course description from the college course catalog for each human service course on transcripts is required for individuals whose degree is not one specifically indicated under the "Areas of Study within Human Services Field." If the course description is minimal or does not include the minimum content, please include a copy of the course syllabus for review.) **AND** a copy of **College Transcripts** identifying student name and school name.
- 3. Resume supporting in detail how you meet requirement b. Experience.
- 4. Documentation that you meet requirement **c. Competency Coursework** by completing one (1) of the following four (4) options:
 - Copy of your Bachelor's Degree in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) -or-
 - Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) Registration number -or-
 - Copy of documentation of 40-hour Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) training PLUS a copy of the completed Competency Assessment that has been signed by both the applicant and the assessor (BCBA / BCaBA) -or-
 - Completed Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), Child Development and Learning college courses. **Please place an asterisk beside** each of the courses on your transcripts that you want considered. <u>Include the course number and name on the application</u>. - Details on specific dates (Month/Day/Year) and hours of experience, description of job duties, diagnosed population served and age of children with whom you have experience.

How do I renew my Habilitative Intervention Certificate of Completion?

Habilitative Intervention Certificates of Completion will be issued for two (2) years. Continuing training requirements for those who hold their Habilitative Intervention Certificate of Completion are outlined in IDAPA 16.03.10.685.07. Individuals who would like to renew their Certificate need to complete the continuing training requirements and submit the Renewal Application for Habilitative Intervention Certificate of Completion prior to their certificate end date. These individuals must complete at least twelve (12) hours of yearly training, six (6) of which must cover behavior methodology or interventions shown to be effective per each year of the certificate.

- Application for renewal must include:
 - o The Renewal Application for Habilitative Intervention Certificate of Completion
 - Updating all personal demographics and current employment information
 - Applicant's signature certifying that the required continued training has been met for each year of the Certificate
